

Picture Story Patterns with Addition

Children need to be fluent with any addition pattern, starting from any number. The more children work with numbers and patterns the easier number patterns become.

One person asks a pattern question and the other person has to answer it as quickly as they can.

Example:

There are 3 frogs in the pond and 4 more frogs jump in. How many frogs are in the pond? 4 more frogs jump in, 4 more frogs jump in, 4 more frogs jump in...



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There are 7 apples on the tree and the next day 5 more apples are on the tree. How many apples are on the apple tree? The next day there are 5 more apples, the next day there are 5 more apples...

There are 10 apples on the tree and the next day 7 more apples are on the tree. How many apples are on the apple tree? The next day there are 7 more apples, the next day there are 7 more apples....
